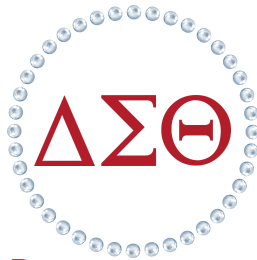

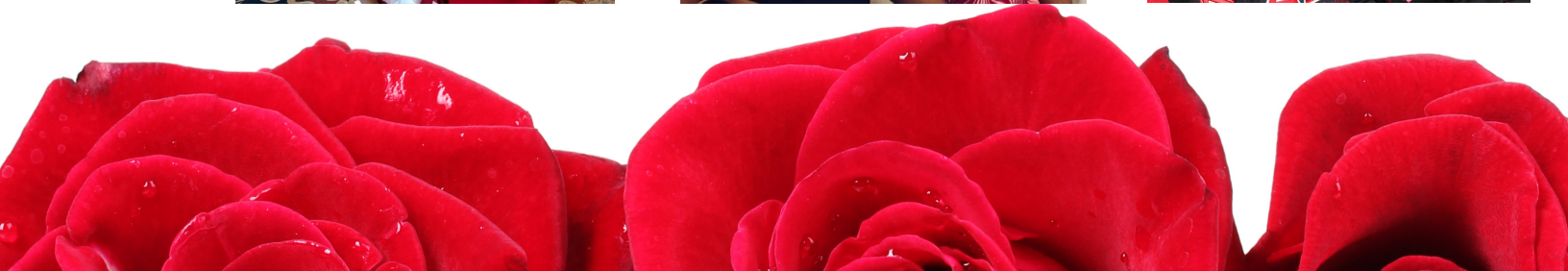

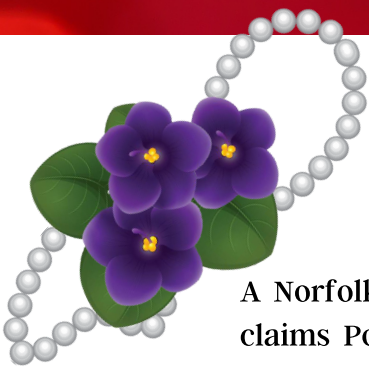

A Norfolk native, **Soror Joyice Ann Powell Jones** claims Portsmouth home since she grew up there. An honor graduate of I.C. Norcom High School, she enrolled at Lincoln University (PA) in 1968 and was initiated into Delta Sigma Theta on November 16, 1969, through Epsilon Phi, a city-wide undergrad chapter in Philadelphia, because there were no sororities on campus at the former all-male school. This pledge line gave Epsilon Phi enough Sorors on campus to form a Chapter of their own. Soror Powell was honored to be one of 16 women to charter Zeta Omega Chapter on December 13, 1969 – her most cherished Delta accomplishment. However, a great regret was her not graduating from Lincoln. Soror Powell Jones joined Suffolk Alumnae in 1997 by invitation. Inspired by her Sorors, and wanting to fulfill Delta's membership requirement of being a college-educated woman, she returned to school and earned two Bachelor's and one Master's degree from three different universities. Before taking a leave of absence from SAC, Soror Powell Jones chaired the Heritage & Archives, Computer Projects, and Publicity Committees; served on the Arts & Letters, Ways & Means, and Cotillion Souvenir Journal Committees; and helped in other areas where needed.

Soror Powell Jones worked many years in various jobs before retiring in 2011. She is now a part-time Administrative Assistant and Tour Guide at Riddick's Folly House Museum in Suffolk. Her hobbies are reading, traveling, and dining out. Last year she celebrated 26 years of marriage with Rev. Dr. Wong-ya G. Jones, Sr. She is the proud mother of a daughter, two sons, and a stepson, who has blessed his dad and her with seven grandchildren and three great-grands. Her favorite Biblical passage is Philippians 4:4-7, 11-13. Soror Powell Jones is glad to be back with SAC and looks forward to being an active member again.

# REDISTRICTING 101

Provided by Social Action

**The National Social Action Commission held a webinar to educate Sorors about Redistricting:** Every ten years our country has a census that is used to determine the change in the count of the population. That count determines the redistribution of the 435 seats in the U.S. House of Representatives known as **reapportionment**.



**Redistricting** is the process of drawing electoral district boundaries to make each district have the same number of people. Throughout the process when a party has control of a district, and they manipulate the boundaries to create a result that either helps their party or hurts the other party, that is political **gerrymandering**. Gerrymandering is not fair, and always has a negative effect on communities of color. To attempt to eliminate gerrymandering and make redistricting fair many states have different ways to draw lines.

In Virginia, we voted on a constitutional amendment to form a bipartisan commission. The commission has eight legislators and eight members who were nominated by the General Assembly leaders and picked by a panel of retired judges. Due to COVID-19, Virginia's Redistricting Commission is still waiting on data from the 2020 Census to draw new legislative maps. Meanwhile, we will have to rely on old maps that were drawn in 2011. However, the great news is that in 2019, the courts stepped in to end racial gerrymandering and had to redraw 11 maps (Suffolk was one of them), and many surrounding areas benefited from the court order.

This is a prime example of why it's important to vote in every election and complete every census. The census affects our way of life in numerous ways. In November, Virginia will have every seat in the House of Delegates up for reelection along with the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General. Many cities will also have several offices up for election such as Commonwealth Attorney, Treasurer, Commissioner of Revenue, Clerk of Court, Sheriff, and the Soil and Water Commission.

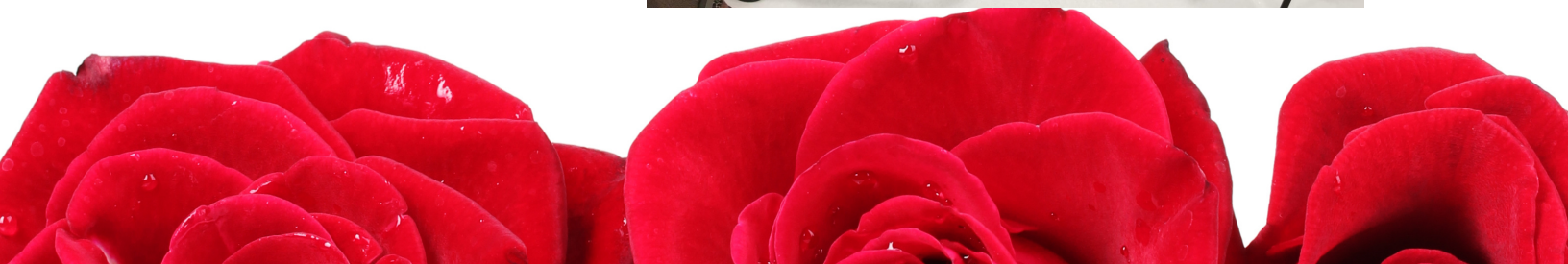
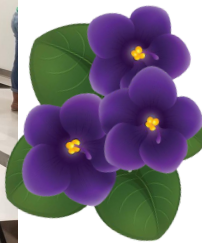
