The students of Suffolk Public Schools were blessed by the School Supply Give-Away we sponsored with other Divine Nine Organizations. 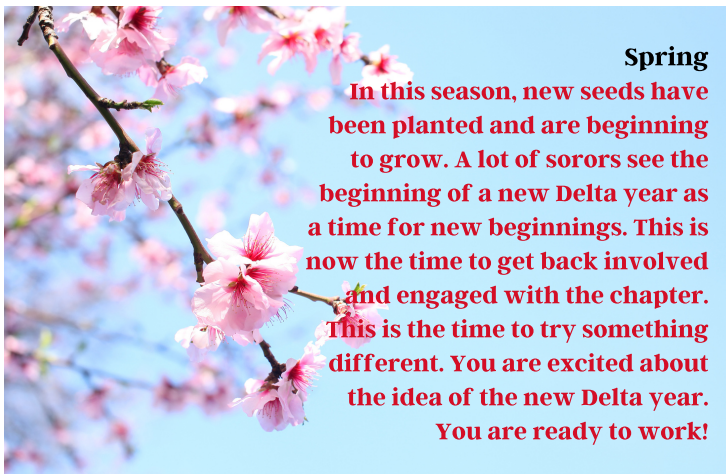


Seasons of Sisterhood

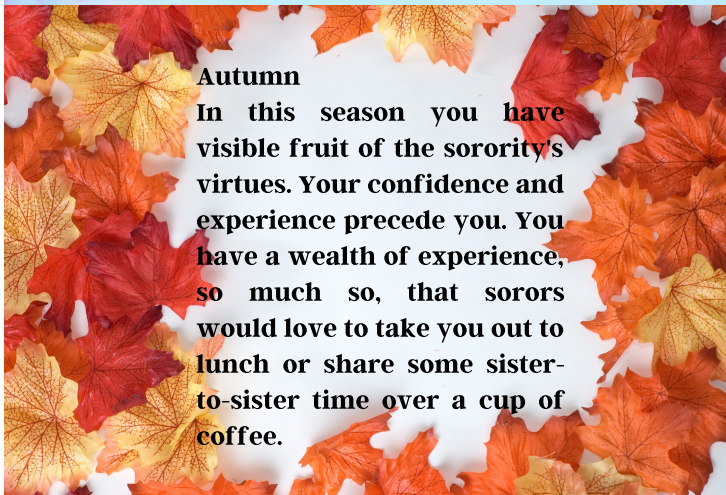
Summer

DELTA DEAR SPOTLIGHT

Soror Jan Elion was born and raised in New Orleans, Louisiana. Soror Jan is proud to say her neighborhood, Pontchartrain Park, was recently placed on the National Register of Historic Places. She graduated from St. Mary's Academy, an all-girls school taught by the Sisters of Holy Family Nuns. The Sisters of Holy Family Nuns were the only Black Nuns in the U.S. at that time. She said, "It was there where I learned how rewarding it is to give back to the community."

Soror Elion attended Dillard University in New Orleans. She was initiated in the Beta Gamma Chapter at Dillard University in 1973. Soror Elion was #18 on her line, and her line name was Ms. Marcher. Soror Elion called all the cadence for her line and the chapter once she crossed. In 1977, Soror Elion received a B.S. degree in Nursing and a B.A. degree in Psychology.

Soror Jan Elion was vice president of the Beta Gamma Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Chapter, Incorporated, and served as Dean of Pledges. Soror Jan said, "this was a very rewarding experience for her because she was able to nurture future Deltas." Soror Elion's fondest memory in Delta was attending the 2008 National Convention in Orlando and when her line sister, Cynthia M.A. Butler-McIntyre, became our 24th National President. Soror Elion said, "it was a moment we would never forget, and all 18 of our line sisters attended the convention." Soror Jan was also a New Orleans Alumnae Chapter member and a Member-at-Large due to her husband's military career.

While working at Optima Health, Soror Elion met Soror Rhonda Peebles, and she invited her to a Suffolk Alumnae Chapter (SAC) meeting. In fall 2008, Soror Jan changed her membership from Member-at-Large to SAC. Soror Elion stated, "I have enjoyed every moment. It has been wonderful watching this chapter grow throughout the years." While at SAC, Soror Elion has served as Chair of Ways and Means and Financial Secretary.

Soror Elion's commitment to community service and excellent organizational skills can assist with furthering the work of Delta through SAC. She has been a room parent and the Cheerleader and Softball Mom when her daughters were younger. Soror Jan started this journey with Delta 47 years ago and will continue to give as much as she can and wherever she is needed. Soror Elion said, "The last year was rough, but I'm back."

Soror Elion has been a nurse for over 45 years. She started her Nursing career as an O.B./Nursery nurse and has worked in an orthopedic unit. However, being a military spouse, she realized doing shift work with two small children was not ideal. As a result, for the past 30 years, Soror Jan has been working in Data Analytics and monitoring the performance of healthcare providers.

Soror Elion met her husband while working at a government hospital in New Orleans. He was a Coast Guard Corpsman. They met in August 1978 and were married in February 1979. They were married 40 years before he passed away in 2020. Soror Jan said, "My friends didn't think it would last; he wasn't from New Orleans. My parents didn't know his parents. We only knew each other for six months, and most of all, he wasn't the type of guy I dated in high school." Soror Jan dated guys who played sports or at least liked sports, particularly football. However, Terry was not a football fan. She said, "I had the big screen T.V. for myself every Sunday." They were opposite. She said, "he was very quiet, and those of you who know me, I'm not, even at my age." They have two daughters and one granddaughter, who is keeping her busy. Soror Jan looks forward to retiring soon so she can spend more time with her.

Soror Elion's hobbies include reading a good book with a glass of wine or two, with some music in the background. She said, "I'm good for the day." Soror Jan considers herself a foodie, and her favorite food is seafood.

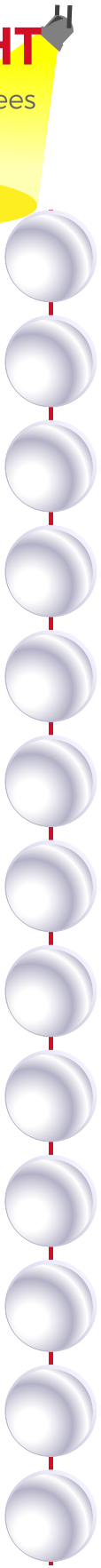

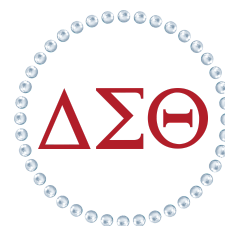
Accomplishments for this year:
